

The Report of WAIK I Nyanza Manga Self Help Group 5/1/2011

The Manga Hill village lies on the northern part of upper Kanyambo location and is bordering Ruma National Parks headquarters to the south.

The village was lucky to receive well wishers from Sweden who were none other than Johannes, Karin and My. The three were the first white to set foot into the village. Upon their visit to the village they saw need to rescue the community. They made a very gentle promise, later they fulfilled it by bringing water purifiers to the village.

Launching was done on Sunday 9th of January 2011. 65 households receives the purifiers.

On Wednesday 5th of January 2011 the three well wishers made a physical visit to the households to educate and tell communities on the importance and how to use the purifiers. On that day 37 households were visited and they received teaching. Monitoring was to be done later on the houses by the project coordinator Mr. Tom Nyangor.

On Saturday 22nd January and Sunday Mr. Johannes who is known by the community as “Good Luck” took his time and visited the remaining households. He was with the coordinator. There after they held a meeting with the community to reinforce the hygienic conditions and use of purifiers. He advised the community to form a group and he gave them 500 KSH (Kenya shillings five hundred) for registration with the social services.

Monitoring work uses left to the coordinator. Findings of the report showed that some members had not started use the purifiers. The rest were taught on how to clean and use the purifiers.
